



**Life Group Questions  
(Matthew 27:11-31)**

1. Read Matthew 27:11-31 together. For more context read the parallel accounts in Luke 23:1-25 and John 18:28-19:16. What stands out to you from this passage? What questions come to mind?
2. Why do you think Matthew is now focusing on the kingship of Jesus? Why hasn't he focused more on that throughout his gospel? Why only in these last few scenes of Jesus' trial and crucifixion?
3. In Matthew's gospel, the most unlikely people seem to understand who Jesus is, while those we assume would get it, don't. Why do you think that it? Do you see that in our day and age?
4. Pastor Andrew said in the application on Sunday that there are only 2 kingdoms - Jesus' and Satan's. You cannot take a neutral approach to Jesus. Do you agree? Why or why not? If you feel open to sharing, have you taken a neutral approach to Jesus?
5. What do you think it means to do life in Jesus' kingdom right now? Do most Christians live like this? Why or why not?
6. What areas of your life are you not submitting to Jesus as King? (ie. finances, work, school, family...) What steps can you take to submit to the Lordship of Jesus?

*Spend some time praying for each other. Ask God for help in submitting to Jesus as King. Ask for help in living as kingdom people in the here and now.*
