



Life Group Study Questions
Matthew 22:1-14

1. Read Luke 10:25-37 together. As you think about this weekend's sermon, what stood out to you? What questions come to mind? Was there anything unclear or confusing?
2. Walk through the back and forth conversation between the lawyer and Jesus. Does Jesus' answer surprise you? Why or why not? Compare this conversation to the rich young ruler in Matthew 19:16-22. What are the similarities? Differences?
3. What is shocking about the parable of the good Samaritan? Why does Jesus choose the "bad guy" to be the hero of the story?
4. Pastor Andrew's first point was: "The questions we ask reveal the motivation of our hearts". Why was the lawyer's questions misguided? What questions have you asked in the past that have revealed where your heart was at? (Think through the examples Andrew gave)
5. The second point was: "Overcomplicated obedience is often a mask for disobedience". What are some examples of how we do this in our own walks with Jesus? How can morality actually be a coverup for a rebellious heart?
6. The third point was: "If you can't love your neighbour, you don't understand the love of God". How does understanding God's love for you affect our love of others?
7. Who is someone that you have been struggling to love as a neighbour? What steps can you take to rectify this?
