

Life Group Study Questions Acts 22:30-23:11

- 1. Read Acts 23:12-35 together. As you think about this weekend's sermon, what stood out to you? What questions come to mind? Was there anything unclear or confusing?
- 2. Have you ever had a "coincidental or lucky" moment? Talk about what made the moment seem so coincidental? As a Christian, did you see God's hand in it?
- 3. God's providence could be defined as: "The act of purposefully providing for, or sustaining and governing the world." Do you struggle with the fact that God is in control of all things? Why or why not?
- 4. Walk through our passage: in what ways do you see God's hand at work to fulfill his promise that he made in verse 11?
- 5. Look up the following passages that speak about God's providence over all things and discuss:

- Psalm 104:14-15 - Mark 1:27 - Isaiah 42:5-6 - Job 1:6-12 - Proverbs 21:1 - Job 34:14-15

- Job 38-39 - 2 Timothy 2:24-26

- 6. Why do you think so many Christians try and argue against God being in control of all things? What are some of the arguments you've heard?
- 7. Pastor Andrew's first application was: "Trusting God's providence gives us patience when things go against us." Do you have an example of when you had to trust God's plan and will for your life?
- 8. Pastor Andrew's second application was: "Trusting God's providence makes us thankful when things go well." How does trusting God's control give you contentment in any circumstance? Read Philippians 4:10-13 to see Paul's perspective.
- 9. Pastor Andrew's third application was: "Trusting God's providence gives us confidence in our faithful God." Do you believe God actually works out <u>all</u> things for our good and his glory? Even the bad things?
