



## **Life Group Study Questions Ecclesiastes 10**

1. Read Ecclesiastes 10 together. As you think about this weekend's sermon, what stood out to you? What questions come to mind based on the passage? Was there anything unclear or confusing?
2. Think about examples of wisdom and foolishness in our own culture. Do you see wisdom and foolishness being diametrically opposed to one another? (ie. wisdom is right and folly is left)
3. In verses 5-7, the Preacher talks about an error he sees: foolish people ruling in high places. Think of examples of this in our own culture (be objective and kind, don't just slam our rulers)
4. In verses 8-15 the Preacher talks through some of the dangers of being foolish. Practically, have you experienced setbacks and consequences from making foolish decisions?
5. In verses 16-20 the Preacher again talks about the difference between wise and foolish leaders. Can you think of an example of each in your own life/our culture? What makes a leader wise? What makes them foolish?
6. The first application from the message was "Followers of Jesus should pursue a life of wisdom." Read Matthew 7:24-29 where Jesus speaks about following his teaching. What areas in your life can you grow in wisdom? What are steps you can take?
7. The second application from the message was "Followers of Jesus are dual citizens." Why is it so important to remember your citizenship in heaven? How does that change the way you react to earthly leaders?
